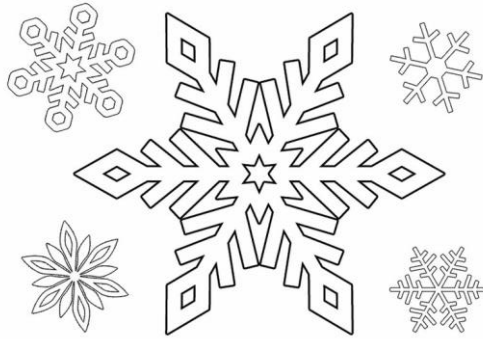


Duck Extended Day Notes, Jan 2019



Sensory activities stimulate children's senses and gives them imagination and hands on learning. In January, we will learn how polar bears survive in cold climates and some stories related to that, such as "*The Little Polar Bear*" series by Hans De Beer. This month our crafts are focused on arctic animals, snowflakes and snowman. We will study snowflakes and identify the different shapes of snowflakes.
